about us

Cache Creek Casino Resort is owned and operated by the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation in Brooks, California. Since its humble beginnings as a bingo hall in 1985, Cache Creek Casino Resort has become one of Northern California's largest casino-resort destinations. Located 40 miles northwest of Sacramento and 80 miles from the San Francisco Bay Area, it features over 2,300 slot machines, more than 80 table games, 659 four-diamond luxury hotel rooms, 11 restaurants, a full-service spa, extraordinary entertainment in a 1,375-seat Event Center, and an 18-hole championship golf course.

timeline

1985

June 25 - Rumsey Band of Wintun Indians opens Cache Creek Indian Bingo on their Rancheria in Brooks, Calif.

1993

October 7 - The tribe adds card games and video lottery machines and changes its name to Cache Creek Indian Bingo & Casino.

1996

August 26 - Expansion plans begin to add casino space and construct restaurants.

1998

The original 1,200-seat Bingo Hall is refurbished. Creekside Buffet opened in October, and China Camp opened in December.

1999

Summer - Table game rotunda and executive office mezzanine level added to Cache Creek Indian Bingo.

September 10 - California Gov. Gray Davis signs Tribal-State Gaming Compact with 58 tribes, including the Rumsey Band of Wintun Indians.

2000

August - Cache Creek Indian Bingo & Casino gets its first Class III (Nevada-style) slot machines.

2002

June 15 - General Manager Randy Takemoto announces plan to build the elegant new Cache Creek Casino Resort, which will be twice the size of the existing casino, including eight new restaurants and a 200-room luxury hotel.

October 16 - Groundbreaking occurs at Cache Creek Casino Resort.

November - Cache Creek Indian Bingo & Casino reduces Bingo Hall seating to 800 seats to make way for more slots, bringing the total number of machines to 1,762.

2004

April 5 - Cache Creek Casino Resort opens, including Club 88, Harvest Buffet, Blue Point Oyster Bar, The Deli and Sweets, Etc.

April 23 - Creekside Café and new gift shop open.

April 29 - C² Steak and Seafood restaurant opens.

May 7 - Loco Caliente opens.

May 9 - Event Center opens.

May 17 - Kung Fu Fat's opens.

June 3 - Hotel and Health Spa opens.

2008

January - 18-Hole Championship Golf Course, Yocha Dehe Golf Club, opens.

2017

June - Work begins on South Tower Expansion.

2019

January - The expanded Spa at Cache Creek Casino Resort opens.

2020

June - South Tower Expansion is completed and soft open to guests.

2021

September - Entertainment returns to Cache Creek.

October 13 - The South Tower expansion officially opens in a limited capacity due to COVID-19.

Over twenty years ago, the site of the future golf course wasn't much to look at. The tribe turned to Sacramento-based architect and former PGA Tour pro Brad Bell, gave him a generous budget, and essentially turned him loose — a practice that has made Native American golf courses among the best that have opened in recent decades.

No homes encroach on the layout, and Bell moved considerable earth to separate fairways and create contours in the terrain. The young oak trees he planted have matured and are now in harmony with the extensive native oaks along the creek. The Tribe ensured that the routing avoided sacred grounds, and each hole is named in the Patwin language, many after the wildlife that reflects the nature of the challenge.

For example, No. 18 is called Selai, or Bear, apt for the beastly finisher. No. 8 is Sedeo, or Coyote, fitting, given its wily nature.
